

STAN MILLER WATERCOLOR PAINTING/ Beginner

(in Spokane, go to Spokane Art Supply for supplies)

(If students already have some of these items, no need to purchase new items)

Watercolor Paper I suggest 2 sheets (22" x 30") Arches 140-lb. cold press.

Watercolor Brushes Beginning students need a 1" flat watercolor brush. Ask Spokane Art supply helpers what 1" brush Stan Miller recommends for beginners.

Watercolor Palette Palette. A simple large white dinner plate will work for the beginner. I'll explain palette options during the first lesson.

Watercolor Paints Beginners need a tube of Paynes Gray or Lamp Black or some kind of a black. They also need a strong red, yellow and blue. I recommend Grahams Azo Yellow, Quinacridone Red and Phthalocyanine Blue Red Shade. If you cannot get these specific colors then try to find a color chart for the colors you are considering. Find the brightest and most intense red, yellow and blue. Ask Spokane Art supply assistance what red, yellow and blue Stan Miller recommends.

Water container Should be able to hold at least a pint of water.

Sponge An inexpensive grocery store sponge, not an art store sponge. Paper towels will also work.
Pencil and eraser (suggest kneaded eraser and number #2 pencil)

Masking tape
