New Students Will Need: \$10 per class plus:

Arches rag 140# cold pressed paper (Rag is the secret for watercolor)

Pencils & Eraser: # 2 is fine and a kneaded eraser.

Sketchbook: Aqua-bee Yellow tablet or Red Spiral, or Strathmore Wind Power 7 (These are for testing paint and thumbnail sketches.) The Nature Sketch is very good.

Brushes: #5, 8, 10-12 round brushes; $\frac{1}{2}$ " - 1 inch flat; a Squirrel # 14 is nice to have. I like Steven Quiller Brushes or. *You may also purchase a detail #3 round brushes. There is another brand of brushes just in that I like. Ask someone to help you. They are inexpensive and are black in color.*

Pigments: Artist Grade advised: Cool & Warm Primary colors of Graham Pigments plus Brown Madder Dan Smith (or Burnt Sienna Dan Smith) & Raw Sienna. *I also use Aureolyn Yellow (by Dan Smith); Gamboge Yellow; Cadmium Yellow Light ; cadmium Yellow Medium; Permanent Rose HWC; or Quinacridone Rose by Graham; Alizarin Crimson ; Q Red (Graham) **Cadmium Red Lighter and more transparent light red such as vermilion.**; Cobalt Blue; Ultramarine Blue; Cerulean Blue; Pthalo Blue; Peacock blue; Viridian; Hookers Green;*

Note: *We have made up palettes available with near what I have mentioned above. For starting Watercolor, these palettes are most helpful.*

Palette: I use Steve Quiller large palette designed for color wheel;

Misc. Supplies: two pint containers of clean cold water (which we have available); an old terry towel and wash cloth or rag; paper towels; Kleenex tissue; Exacto knife; table or kosher salt; Masking fluid (White Magic or Pebeo drawing Mask); Wide masking or freezer tape (not blue!) from your favorite hardware store; # 2 pencil; Kneaded eraser; cut up stiff credit card; Optional: a sturdy gator type board or two sheets of foam core board wrapped together with adhesive plastic. Note: the board needs to be strong and not warp). This board will need to be approximately 16" x 20". Plywood works but needs varnishing on both sides to avoid acid entering your paper.
